Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports - What is PBIS?


Philosophy:

- PBIS is a team based, systematic approach in teaching behavioral expectations throughout the school. It is based on a proactive model which teaches the behaviors, reinforces and recognizes students who are able to model these behaviors and has systems in place to support students who have a difficult time or may present with more challenging behaviors.
- The team approach is what truly makes this system work and we really need every family's support to help us be successful.

Approach:

- Instead of using a patchwork of individual behavioral management plans, we have moved to a school-wide discipline system that addresses the entire school, the classroom, areas outside the classroom (such as hallways, restrooms, offices, cafeteria, playground/school grounds etc.).
- Every person who works in the school is aware of the behavioral expectations and works to ensure students are consistently getting the same message, regardless of the setting they are in or the adult they come in contact with

Why PBIS?



For <u>our kid's</u> sake:

- ✓ The majority of our students are meeting our expectations so why not recognize them for their efforts
- ✓ Our kids are coming with more and more ACEs kids need positive relationships with staff
- ✓ Decrease off task behaviors and increase on task behaviors

For <u>our</u> sake:

- ✓ We tend to spend the majority of our day focusing on the off task behaviors – wouldn't it be fun to flip that and focus on the positive!
- ✓ Make teaching/school climate more fun

- 1. Emotional abuse
- 2. Physical abuse


- 1. Witnessing domestic violence
- 2. Alcohol or substance abuse in the home
- 3. Mentally ill or suicidal household members
- 4. Parental marital discord (as evidenced by divorce)
- 5. Incarcerated household member

Washington School Classroom (30 Students) Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)

6 students with no ACE
5 students with 1 ACE
6 students with 2 ACEs
3 students with 3 ACEs
7 students with 4 or 5 ACEs
3 students with 6 or more ACE

58% (17) students with <u>no</u> exposure to physical abuse or adult to adult violence 29% (9) of students exposed to physical abuse <u>or</u> adult to adult violence

7 students with 4 or 5 ACEs
3 students with 6 or more ACEs



| Classroom | Follow your teacher's directions and work together. | Be positive. Smile and use kind words. Be kind to others. | Recess | Share equipment, space, and include others that are left out in games and play. Follow rules of the games. Report health concerns to supervisors before whistle is blown. | Use kind words and display good sportsmanship. | Follow directions of playground supervisors. Report bullying. Use appropriate language. | Put away equipment you have used. Include those who are left out. Keep track of personal belongings and bring them indoors with you. | Make safe decisions in all areas and games. Move to lines as soon as you hear the whistles blow. Use equipment the way it was designed to be used. Keep hands and feet to self. |
| Hallway | Face forward while walking in a straight line with hands kept to self. Use quiet feet. Walk in single file line up and down the stairs. Smile and wave. Take turn when opening lockers. | Be patient and wait for students or adults entering the hallway from classrooms or the cafeteria. | Turn voices off as you move through the hallways, stairwells, and learning spaces. Open and close lockers safely and quietly. | Be a good role model for other students. | Walk on right-hand side of hallway and stairs. "Right on Rail" when climbing stairs. Hands and feet to self. Use lockers for school |
| Bathroom | Be mindful of other students' space. | Try to use the bathroom at appropriate times such as recess. | Put trash in can. Use quiet voices in restroom. Use only two pumps at the soap dispenser. | Use time wisely. Leave the bathroom better than how you found it. | Wash your hands. Report any vandalism or saftey issues to teacher or office. |
| Cafeteria | Clean up your eating area. Eat your own food. Enter and exit for the playground through the double doors by the counselor's office. | Say please and thank you as you move through the lunch line. | Practice good table manners. Use inside voice. | Slide over to allow students to be seated next to you with a positive attitude. | Remain seated in one spot until you are dismissed by an adult. |
| Assembly | Follow teacher directions. | Honor the hard work of the presenter or classes by being a good listener. | Listen/watch and use appropriate applause. Remain seated on your pockets so all can see speaker. | Be a good role model by using good manners. | Remain seated in one spot. Enter and exit the the area in a calm manner with voices off. |

WHAT IS PBIS?

PBIS is:

- a positive behavior management process to make Jason Lee a safe place.
- a system of clear school wide expectations with consequences and incentives.
- interventions when you need help.
- recognition and celebration for your successes!

What does PBIS do for you?

- Students are recognized and praised for positive behaviors.
 - Cougar Cash, Extra Recess, Prizes, Special jobs, Time with adults
- Students receive interventions to help them self manage their unsuccessful behaviors.
 - Teacher-student conference, parent contact,
 Classroom Reset, Make it Right, parent conference,
 office referral, CARES room

How does PB18 work?


 All students follow the same set of rules and expectations throughout all areas in the building.



Grade Level Recognition



Days

Any particular day when there are NO office referrals that break any of the CARES rules

Results = 1 Peace Day

- ✓ Office referrals will result in a lost Peace Day
- ✓ When a particular grade level accumulates a certain number of peace days, the entire grade will be recognized
- ✓ The target levels are: 5, 10, 20, 30, 50, 75, and 100 days

Peace Days

No office referrals for the day equals 1 peace day. Student referrals may include discipline referrals from the classroom, playground, specials, hallways, or bathrooms.


- 5th: 5 minutes extra recess

Awesome Attendance Day


No Tardies or Absences for the entire class equals 1 Awesome Attendance Day. Preexcused absences accepted.





 - ➤ Walking, Showing Manners, Speaking quietly, picking up after self
- If your class meets the cafeteria expectations for that day, you class will earn a "Cafe Day."
- ➤ When a class accumulates a certain number of Cafe Days, the entire class will be recognized.
- The target levels are: 5, 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 75, and 100 days.

Café Day

Classes can earn a Café Day by following the CARES rules while in the cafeteria
